Connect the Controls

At SOGO we run with orienteering maps to show us where to go. Each orienteering map has a triangle to show the start, the triangle points to the first control. Each control is marked with a circle. Start at the triangle and connect all the controls until the end of the course (double circle).



Orienteering@Home Challenge

Orienteering flags are squares that are made up of 2 triangles put together. One triangle is orange and the other is white. Print and cut the orienteering flags out.

Draw a map of your yard (or house), make sure to include big items that are landmarks in your yard (or house). Put a start triangle where you want your grown up to start, then put a circle for each control flag you want them to stop at, and a double circle for the end. Try making 6 control flags to stop at.

Your grown up can also draw a map of the same space, and put start, controls and finish on that map for you.
